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
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GUJARAT STHAPNA DIVAS

1ST May 2016 was the 56th Gujarat Sthapna Divas. It is also celebrated in other countries like USA, UK, Australia, Canada, Africa and some other countries where Gujaratis stay. Gujarat is the state of Western India. In north, it is at the border of Rajasthan, in south at Maharashtra. It is bordered by Madhya Pradesh to the east and Arabian Sea, Sindh to the west. The capital of Gujarat is Gandhinagar.

The history of Gujarat is five thousand years old. It started right from Indus Valley Civilization. In Nanda, Satvahana, Maurya and Gupta dynasty the trade was carried particularly from Bharuch. After Gupta dynasty, Gujarat was flourished as independent Hindu-cum- Buddhist state. The Gurjara-Pratihara reign ruled this state in 8th to 10th century. Then Solanki dynasty held the reins of Gujarat state. Till 13th century the Solanki dynasty was in power. In tail-ending years of 12th century and onset of 13th century, Allauddin Khilji included Gujarat in Delhi. In 14th century the ruler Sultan Ahmed Shah took the reins of state in his hand and declared Ahmedabad as the capital of Gujarat.

In the year 1411, Ahmed Shah was the Sultan of Gujarat and he ruled Gujarat from 1411 to 1442. The name of Ahmedabad is given by him. He founded Ahmadnagar which is presently known as Himmatnagar in the year 1426. In 15th Century Mughal emperors ruled the state of Gujarat. Aurangzeb, the sixth Mughal emperor, was born in Dahod. When he was born, emperor Jehangir was in power.

In 18th century Marathas had taken the possession of central and eastern Gujarat. In 18th century the Marathas, namely Gaekwad ruled Gujarat. Then, British East India Company had taken the control. The state of Gujarat came under the authority of Bombay Presidency except Baroda. Right from that period to the year 1947 Gujarat was divid-

ed into many princely states. Ahmedabad, Baroda and some other cities were ruled by British authorities. After independence few years passed and then in 1960 Gujarat got its own identity by separating it from Bombay. Then, from that very period to the year 1995 the power of Gujarat was in the hands of Indian National Congress. From the year 1998 till date Bhartiya Janta Party is in the power.

After independence the government had made three groups of Gujarat state, namely Saurashtrea, Kutch and Bombay State. The first capital of Gujarat was Ahmedabad. In 1970 the capital was moved to Gandinagar. In 1974 the Navnirman Andolan was launched and it got success to brought changes in corridors of power. In the year 2001 an earthquake of the magnitude 7.7 had shaken the earth and it brought a temporary held up in the speeding progress of Gujarat. Thus, many natural and man-made disasters came here and nature's fury brought a shadow of fear but because of the courage of people, it could not shake the confidence of Gujarat people. The sunshine of good days again brought back its glory. The Guajarat celebrated its 56th Sthapna Divas on 1st May 2016. Gujarat State came into existence as a rising state in the year 1960. Gujarat is the state of Gujarati-speaking people but the people of other states also live here with the spirit of amicability. This state is doing a rapid progress and becoming a role model state for others.


In short, heart with Indian culture , head with divine knowledge through global skill should be the modern teacher's perception to complete the mission to became global educational leader.

Long years ago we made a tryst with destiny, and now the time comes when we shall redeem our pledge, not wholly or in full measure, but very substantially. At the stroke of the midnight hour, when the world sleeps, India will awake to life and freedom."



I have just quoted the words of the first Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru. Here two words have great significance: life and freedom. In fact, there is no life without freedom and there is no freedom without life. Both are inseparable and interdependent. That is why America's great political thinker Thomas Jefferson said: "The God who gave us life, gave us liberty at the same time." From these words the importance of liberty, importance of freedom is quite clear – freedom is equal and equivalent to human life. Emphasizing the utmost importance of freedom our Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi said: "Freedom is the breath of life." That is why he fought for it till his last breath even sacrificing his very life for it. He used to say that our political freedom is useless if we don't have economic, social and moral freedom. After 67 years of Independence we have failed to gain these

That is why

one of the greatest political scientists of our times Harold Laski wrote a 300 page book called "Liberty in the Modern State" and wrote a separate chapter exclusively on "Freedom of the Mind". Look at a small nation like Israel which came into existence only in 1948, one year after our Independence. But today Israel's Human Development Index (HDI) is 17 and ours is 134, and remember, Israel with eight million people is the fourth biggest military power in the world. We don't need to look far for the reason. It is an obvious one - the Jewish people are a thinking people. As a result, they produced the greatest scientist Albert Einstein and other towering thinkers in several fields. So as we celebrate the Independence day let us pledge to make an atmosphere in India where every mind will be a free mind to think and ask the question 'why' like rationalist Narendra Dabholkar who was gunned down last August by forces inimical to the freedom of the mind. Our Constitution has given us the freedom of thought and expression but we have failed miserably to unshackle India's mind from everything that vitiates against this fundamental right. Our Independence will be a true one only when we have the freedom of the mind, where the mind is without fear to think as Tagore envisaged. Let us resolve to make such an India on this great day. Jai Bharat!

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel: Lessons from his life


Dear Friends,

Many people left the city to save their life but Vallabhbhai continued to live in his residence at Bhadra and refused to move out of Ahmedabad for personal safety. It was noticed that he was moving in the streets of Ahmedabad, getting the sewers cleaned and the plague-stricken areas disinfected. When his friends asked him about his safety, he remained silent and simply looked at them. It appeared that he wanted to say, - "I have undertaken the duty of the Chair-

man of the sanitary committee, and how can I seek safety? To leave my post of duty would be a breach of faith with the public, and also, how can I leave the conservancy staff to risk plague, and seek safety for myself." This incident shows that he gave more importance to duty and responsibility than his health. It also shows his concern for his staff and wellbeing of the common people for which he has been considered as one of the great leader of India.

SERVE: You can drop in slices or chunks of fruit, if you like. It looks and tastes great and adds extra vitamins. Enjoy!





Maintain a normal schedule for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Tip-2: Set a weekly time table for your child where you have different activity on the same time every day. This will enable punctuality and sincerity in your child and the different activity will maintain the interest level of your child. You may not give that time table to the child but you must maintain such a time table yourself so that you are clear of what activity you want for your child to be done.

Tip-9: Teach your child some shopping. While you are busy working chores of the house, you can ask your child to buy some grocery for home and there by teach him/her the art of shopping and helping with such work. For example, you can ask your child to bring some Sugar or Tea or Soap etc. from a nearby provision store. Give him/her some money and tell approximate cost of product and what money will be got back. This way your child will learn the art of shopping and also will understand that they should also help in such work at home.

Tip-13: Set a reading time once in a day. During odd hours like bright sunny day or sunny hours when it is not advisable to play out, set some indoor activity. Set a daily reading time where your child will read some story or interesting facts from newspaper or magazine aloud in front of the family to which you will listen patiently. Mark the errors that they make and report them after they finished the reading. Ask them to read it once again with corrections implemented.

Tip-16: Go for a Holiday. Plan a trip to a remote place or to a fun park like Theme Parks, Water Parks and get your child some excitement along with some refreshments for yourself. Going for a trip with your child on such theme park will bring back the fun and excitement in the family along with sense of tolerance and adjustment.

Tip-21: Morning Walk. If possible, wake up your child early and take him for a morning walk. Show him how pleasant the mornings are and make him listen to the birds chirping or tweeting. Take him to a nearby park or play area and show him how people exercise to remain fit and let him take some inspiration from them. Such occasional excursions early in the morning will make him considerate towards nature for its flora and fauna.

Tip-3: Maintain a daily journal for the child where the child will record his daily work and activity in the book. This will ensure that reading and writing skills remain sharp.

Tip-4: Get membership of a Library for the child and let your child visit the library on daily basis to refer to different newspapers, magazines, books, CDs etc. Ask your child to check for some new information every day and record it in his daily journal.

Tip-10: Visit to nearby Vegetable Market. When it's time to purchase some vegetables for home, take your child along and ask him/her to carry the bags. Discuss with him/her what to purchase and how to make selection for such purchase. For example, if Tomatoes are required to be purchased then show him/her how to select the Tomatoes from the bunch, get it weighed and pay for it. This will teach many concepts to the child that is not possible for them to learn in school. The child tends to get more responsible with this activity.

Tip-14: Create a Scrap book. Ask your child to collect their favorite cartoon character cuttings from newspaper or magazine and have them pasted in a scrap book. You can also ask them to cut out some important news or fact from the newspaper and get them pasted in the scrap book. This will help develop identification of important news matter and keeping a track of it and also maintaining such copies.

Tip-17: Share some cooking tips with your child. Vacation time is the best time to be with your child and share some self feeding tips with him or her. Teaching your child to prepare their own food will relieve your tension when you fall ill and would not be in a position to make their breakfast. Show them how to prepare snack of their desire with what is available at home. Allow them to have a hand on practice using the sandwich maker or microwave for preparing their food. This will be an exciting activity for your child and also develop sense of self reliance at times of need.

Tip-22: Movie Time. Plan a Movie day with the kids. You can take them to theater or have a DVD or CD rented for home viewing. If such plan is made for home viewing then you can also ask your child's friend to join for such session as well. Having a movie day will serve their need for entertainment and edutainment. Select appropriate movies that promote some educational or patriotic values.

Tip-5: Ask your child to have a shared routine with friends where they would visit each other at respective houses turn by turn and play accordingly. For example, your child has four friends A,B,C,D, E(your child). Let them get together at A's house on Monday, B's house on Tuesday, C's house on Wednesday and so on... turn by turn. Ask them to play with toys or articles that are available at respective homes. This will strengthen the value of sharing and tolerance amongst them.

Tip-6: Set a day and date of day outing with family or friends and let your child visit some local parks, community play areas, zoo, museum, or such local attraction that will further enhance their knowledge and skill. Ask them to record such experience in their daily journal.

Tip-12: Set a house decoration day. Ask your child to decorate his/her room with their own imagination. Ask for their suggestion and avail them with some decorative stuff like, strings, ropes, wall papers, paints, stencils that are within your reach and tolerance capacity. Discuss what they will do with such articles and allow them the day's time to get it finished. For example, you can ask them to their favorite cartoon character in their room, ask them how they will do it and allow them to work it out within some limits.

Tip-15: Create a Collage. On any fine day when you are free sit with your child and view all the childhood photos of the child. Ask him to separate the photos that they like and prefer. Then ask him to paste it in a Drawing Book or on chart and prepare a collage with them. This will engage them with memories of their childhood and strengthen the bonding amongst the family and will help the child develop a skill for creating collage.

Tip-18: Preparing dough. Give some flour to your child and teach him / her how to prepare dough out of it. This will not only give a good engaging activity but will also make him /her aware of the proportion of material to be used for such work. This will indirectly develop some math and calculation skills along with fine motor activity like using fists to prepare the dough.

Tip-23: Teaching your child bicycle and cycling along with your child would be another exciting activity that you could engage your child in. This will not only give some physical activity to the child but will also boost physical growth of the child and some sport activity. Cycling in early mornings could be very rewarding along with blissful nature experience in the morning.

Tip-7: Set a day, date for outdoor game even with family and friends where you may get together in a group and play outdoor games like Cricket, Badminton, Kho - Kho, Hide and Seek, Treasure Hunt, etc. Have such outing along with packed lunch or dinner from home. This will strengthen the bond between family and friends.

Tip-8: Enroll your child for some sort of skill development in his or her area of interest like drawing, music, singing, art, game, etc. While enrolling your child please make it clear to him that this is vacation activity and will get eventually get over as the school reopens. Also set him some attainable goal that he will have to achieve if such enrollment is done. For example, you can set a goal that in vacation drawing classes you will master the skill of shading.

Tip-11: Set a house cleaning day. Ask your child to help you for some non-routine cleaning of the house where they can help easily and will be ready to work with you. For example, take their help in re-organizing their Shelves, desks, storage houses, etc. Ask for their help in re-organizing the position of the bed or other such articles in their room. This will keep their charm intact as they will be interested to have some new arrangements in their room.

Tip-19: Use indoor games. Set a daily routine where you can play with your child some indoor games like carom, cards, snakes and ladders, solving puzzles, playing monopoly etc. Change the game every day, say, one day carom and another day monopoly. This will not only keep your child engaged but also will enable some mental development by maintaining score, developing tricks, etc.

Tip-24: Computer Skills. Allow your child to learn some computer skills during the vacation. Enroll in a nearby computer class or a community driven computer classes where he could not only learn basic computing skills but can also make friends. Basic computer skills involve learning computer hardware, software, MS-Office. Typing is an essential skill of 21st century, a candidate with accurate typing skills would be most sought after in present times.

Tip-20: Drama Time. Allow your child to watch his or her favourite TV program and ask them to enact their favorite dialogue, play or character while all the family gets together. This will not only improve their observation and memory skills but also will develop representation skills which are very much essential in day to day life.

CONSTRUCTIVE ENGAGEMENTS DURING VACATION



The men's team was able to win a bronze medal. The mixed pair was also adjudged with the third position and was able to secure a bronze medal.

The women's team comprised Dww, Bombayla Devi Laishram and Laxmirani-Majhi. Despite a lower rank of the final contender, the Indian women lost the game due to a few inconsistencies in the third set.

The Indian men's recurve team consisted of Jayanta Talukdar, Mangal Singh and Atanu Das. They were able to beat the ninth seed British team by 6-0 to secure the bronze medal.

The mixed pair team comprising Deepika Kumari and Atanu Das were able to send the much hyped Koreans back to pavilion in a nail biting finisher which concluded at 5-4 in favour of the Indians.

PSLV-C31 SUCCESSFULLY LAUNCHES INDIA'S 5th NAVIGATION SATELLITE IRNSS-1E

ISRO's Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle, PSLV-C31, successfully launched the 1425 kg IRNSS-1E, the fifth satellite in the Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS) today morning (January 20, 2016) from Satish Dhawan Space Centre SHAR, Sriharikota. This is the thirty second consecutively successful mission of PSLV and the eleventh in its 'XL' configuration.

After the PSLV-C31 lift-off at 0931 hrs (9:31 am) IST from the Second Launch Pad with the ignition of the first stage, the subsequent important flight events, namely, strap-on ignitions and separations, first stage separation, second stage ignition, heat-shield separation, second stage separation, third stage ignition and



separation, fourth stage ignition and satellite injection, took place as planned. After a flight of about 18 minutes 43 seconds, IRNSS-1E Satellite was injected to an elliptical orbit of 282.4 km X 20,655.3 km inclined at an angle of 19.21 degree to the equator (very close to the intended orbit) and successfully separated from the PSLV fourth stage. After injection, the solar panels of IRNSS-1E were deployed automatically. ISRO's Master Control Facility (at Hassan, Karnataka) took over the control of the satellite. In the coming days, four orbit manoeuvres will be conducted from Master Control Facility to position the satellite in the Geosynchronous Orbit at 111.75 deg East longitude with 28.1 deg inclination.

THE SCIENCE OF SUMMER

How Air Conditioners Work?

- An air conditioner is able to make the temperature in a room nice and cool because of a special chemical called a coolant. The specialty of the coolant is that it has properties that easily allow it to change back and forth between a liquid and a gas.
- The inside of an AC is a windy tube containing the coolant. When the coolant changes from one state to another there is a large transfer of energy which is what is responsible for cooling a room. The part of the tube with the compressor is outside and the evaporator along with the outlet for cool air is inside the room. When the liquid coolant reaches

the evaporator, it absorbs the heat around it and turns into a gas.

- This warm gas then passes through the compressor. The compressor transforms the gas back into a liquid by squashing all the heat out of it. The hot air is expelled outside the room and the cool liquid continues down its path. This process continuously recycles warm air into cool air. Your fridge works the same way, just think of the room as much tinier and the food as the people.

FUN WITH SCIENCE

Brighten your science knowledge with our fun light facts for kids. Enjoy interesting trivia related to color, the speed of light, optics, sunlight, ultraviolet light and infrared light. Understand how electromagnetic radiation works and discover the many fascinating properties of light.

In physics, light refers to electromagnetic radiation. The light we normally talk about in everyday life refers to the visible spectrum (the part of the electromagnetic spectrum that the human eye can see).

Other animals can see parts of the spectrum that humans can't. For example, a large number of insects can see ultraviolet (UV) light.

UV light can be used to show things the human eye can't see, coming in handy for forensic scientists.

The wavelength of infrared light is too long to be visible to the human eye.

Scientists study the properties and behaviours of light in a branch of physics known as optics.

Isaac Newton observed that a thin beam of sunlight hitting a glass prism on an angle creates a band of visible colours that includes red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet (ROYGBIV). This occurred because different colours travel through glass (and other mediums) at different speeds, causing them to refract at different angles and separate from each other.

rate from each other.

Light travels very, very fast. The speed of light in a vacuum (an area empty of matter) is around 186,000 miles per second (300,000 kilometres per second).

Light travels slower through different mediums such as glass, water and air. These mediums are given a refractive index to describe by how much they slow the movement of light. Glass has a refractive index of 1.5, meaning that light travels through it at around 124,000 miles per second

(200,000 kilometres per second). The refractive index of water is 1.3 while the refractive index of air is 1.0003, meaning that air only slightly slows down light.

Light takes 1.255 seconds to get from the Earth to the Moon.

Sunlight can reach a depth of around 80 metres (262 feet) in the ocean.

One of the many things Italian scientist Galileo Galilei worked on was telescopes, producing telescopes with around 30x magnification in some of his later work. These telescopes helped him discover the four largest moons orbiting Jupiter (later named the Galilean satellites).

Photosynthesis is a process that involves plants using energy from sunlight to convert carbon dioxide into food.

When he was born, neighbours in the village suggested that his parents smother him. It was better than the pain they would have to go through their lifetime, some said. He is a “useless” baby without eyes... being born blind is a sin, others added.

Twenty-three years later, Srikanth Bolla is standing tall living by his conviction that if the “world looks at me and says, ‘Srikanth, you can do nothing,’ I look back at the world and say I can do anything.”

Srikanth is the CEO of Hyderabad-based Bollant Industries, an organisation that employs uneducated and disabled employees to manufacture eco-friendly, disposable consumer packaging solutions, which is worth Rs 50 crores.

He considers himself the luckiest man alive, not because he is now a millionaire, but because his uneducated parents, who earned Rs 20,000 a year, did not heed any of the ‘advice’ they received and raised him with love and affection. “They are the richest people I know,” says Srikanth.

SUCCESS STORY

What is it about stories like Srikanth’s that so inspire and fill one with hope? Could it be the multiple zeroes after a dollar sign or the belief that you and I can achieve similar success if we set our minds and hearts to it? Underdog success stories touch a raw nerve. After all, everyone faces adversity, they dream, and they work hard.

In Srikanth’s case, being born blind was just one part of the story. He was also born poor. And you know what that means in a society like ours.

In school, he was pushed to the back bench and not allowed to play. The little village school had no way of knowing what inclusion meant. When he wanted to take up science after his class X, he was denied the option because of his disability. All of 18, Srikanth not only fought the system but went on to become the first international blind student to be admitted to the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology



(MIT) in the US.

Today, Srikanth has four production plants, one each in Hubli (Karnataka) and Nizamabad (Telangana), and two in Hyderabad (Telangana). Another plant, which will be one hundred percent solar operated, is coming up in Sri City, an integrated business city in Andhra Pradesh, 55 kms from Chennai.

When his father realised that the child was not learning anything in a city school, he admitted

Srikanth to a special needs school in Hyderabad. The boy thrived in the compassion he was shown there. He not only learnt to play chess and cricket but excelled in them. He topped his class, even embracing an opportunity to work with late President Dr APJ Abdul Kalam in the Lead India project. “When I was the President of India, on 28 Aug 2006, I met the group of tribal students from Lead India 2020 movement. I asked all of them one question: “What you want to become?” Out of many response, one visually challenged boy studying IX class got up. His name is Srikanth, he answered me “I will become visually Challenged Ist President of India”. I was very happy to see his vision and ambition. Small aim is a crime. Hence, I have congratulated him to realize his vision and told him to work for realizing the vision” said Bharat Ratna Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam.

But none of this mattered much because Srikanth was denied admission to the science stream in class XI. He cleared the Andhra Pradesh class X state board exams with over 90 percent marks, but the board said he could only take Arts subjects after that. “Was it because I was born blind? No. I was made blind by the perceptions of the people.” Having been denied the opportunity, Srikanth decided to fight for it. “I sued the government and fought for six months. In the end, I got a government order that said I could take the science subjects but at my ‘own risk’.”

Thus not ‘risking’ anything to chance, Srikanth did whatever he could to prove them wrong. He got all the textbooks converted to audio books, worked day and night to complete the course and managed to secure 98 percent in the XII board exams.

Fortune favours the brave

Sometimes, life mimics a steeplechase. Especially when it comes to those it has big plans for. It did not give Srikanth enough time to bask in his victory when it threw another spanner in the works. He applied for IIT, BITS Pilani, and other top engineering

“I got a letter saying ‘you are blind, hence you are not allowed to apply for competitive exams.’ If IIT did not want me, I did not want IIT either. How long can you fight?”

colleges, but did not get a hall ticket. Instead,

He chose his battles carefully and did his homework searching the Internet to find the best engineering programme for someone like himself. He applied to schools in the US and got into the top four – MIT, Stanford, Berkeley, and Carnegie Mellon. He went to MIT (with a scholarship) as the first international blind student in the school’s history.

It wasn’t easy adjusting to life there, but by and by he started to do well. Towards the end of his bachelor’s course when the ‘what

next’ question came up; it brought him back to where he had started.

“Many questions bothered me. Why should a disabled child be pushed to the back row in the class? Why should the 10 percent of the disabled population of India be left out of the Indian economy? Why can’t they make a living like everyone else with dignity?”

He decided to give up the ‘golden’ opportunity in corporate America and came back to India in search of answers to his questions. He set up a support service platform to rehabilitate, nurture and integrate differently-abled people in society. “We helped about 3000 students in acquiring an education and vocational rehabilitation. But then I thought what about their employment? So I built this company and now employ 150 differently-abled people.”

The boy who was born blind is today showing many the paths to real happiness. He says his three most important life lessons are:

“Show compassion and make people rich. Include people in your life and remove loneliness, and lastly, do something good; it will come back to you.”
